Students should attend all classes from the start of the semester during the registration even before the notification of being accepted to class in the registration.

In case the student **DOES NOT SEE the registration** on his/her USOSweb profile **on Wednesday, 21 February 2018** please **write to contact person** (please send your name, surname, JU ID number + information you cannot see registration)
Registration will become ACTIVE during time of registration: 26.02-01.03.2018 (it will be NOT active before and after)

On the day when you register for the course make sure the course is LINKED to the student's programme! If not - you will be removed from the course on the day after registering. ('linkage' section of USOSweb profile).

RULES of registration

1. Acceptance for the course:

Registration does not mean that the student is successfully registered for the class.

On 2 March 2018 (one the day after the registration finish) students should check their USOSweb account whether they have been accepted to the class or not.

2. Registration:

Acceptance into the course will be decided based on the ranking list and the time of online registration. The assigned rank determines the priority: the higher the rank the higher the possibility of being successfully accepted to the course (in the case that there are more students interested in the course than places available).

For the registrations **WSM.IE.EN2-17/18L** the following ranking list applies:

- Rank of 3: Students enrolled in the fee based MA programmes at the Centre for European Studies
- Rank of 2: All students of the Institute of European Studies/Centre for European Studies (including Erasmus students on exchange at IE, CEEPUS, students enrolled in other international programmes);
- Rank of 1: Students who do belong to any other Department at Jagiellonian University

PLEASE NOTE: courses can only be taken for credit, NOT audited. Student undertake to actively participate in class and complete the required coursework, readings and preparation, as prescribed in the course syllabus

3. Withdrawal:

Students who decide not to attend a course in which they are enrolled may withdraw after the registration finishes under the condition that the Director of Institute of European Studies, dr hab. Krzysztof Kozbiał, agrees to the student's request (via written 'petition' letter). A petition with a suitable request should be submitted no later than 30 days from the day when classes has started in the semester to the contact person (either CES Office at Garbarska 7a or IE Office, at Jodłowa 13). Please be advised that NZAL (niezaliczenie = fail) will be entered in the student's records if he/she will not receive permission to withdraw and will not take the final exam.
