## ENQUIRY

**Application for performing services, value not to exceed a sum of 30,000 euro remuneration for completion of task: seminars or lectures taught for the MA in European Studies programme**

**In the framework of the project entitled "*Research and expertise in society*", realized at the Jagiellonian University, co-financed by grant from Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway through the EEA and Norway Grants and co-financed by the Polish funds. We would like to invite to submit an offer for an enquiry to conduct a course on „Political and Social History of 20<sup>th</sup> Century CEE”**

### 1. Description of the enquiry

The Centre for European Studies seeks to employ on the basis of a specific-task contract to conduct a course on “Political and Social History of 20<sup>th</sup> Century CEE”.

The course will cover the following topics:

1.	CEE (political and social situation) at the turn of 19th and 20th centuries.
2.	The First World War: eastern front. The emergence of a new CEE after the war: the development of new national states in CEE.
3.	Peace settlements after the First World War – the Versailles system. CEE in Europe in the years 1918-1938 in a statistical mirror.
4.	Domestic economic and political problems of CEE countries 1918-1939. Part I. Poland.

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5.	Domestic economic and political problems of CEE countries 1918-1939. Part II. Czechoslovakia and Hungary.
6.	The international situation in Europe at the brink of the Second World War. Hitler's Germany; policy of appeasement; Anschluss, Munich and Polish September 1939.
7.	The Second World War – Poland. Part I – domestic problems.
8.	The Second World War – Poland. Part II – international political developments. CEE in the Second World War. The international dimension of CEE – meetings in Teheran, Yalta, Potsdam and their impact on CEE.
9.	The Second World War – Czechoslovakia, Hungary. The differences between the various CE countries.
10.	The establishment of Communist regimes in CEE 1944-1948.
11.	The outbreak of the Cold War. The Marshall Plan; the two camp policy, the Berlin Blockade, NATO, Warsaw Pact, the forming of FRG and GDR.
12.	Stalinism and the age of terror 1948-1956.
13.	Personality cult and Stalinist propaganda.
14.	The “Thaw” of 1956. XX Congress of the CPSU. Polish October, Hungarian October.
15.	Normalization?: Kadar's Hungary, Gomulka's Poland.
16.	Dubcek's Czechoslovakia and the Prague Spring.
17.	Gierek's Poland. The emergence of democratic opposition in Central Europe. Role of the Church.

#### Responsibilities of the Contractor:

- to conduct a course on “Political and Social History of 20<sup>th</sup> Century CEE” (in English) – 60 teaching hours (1 teaching hour – 45 minutes);

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- to prepare and mark the final exam and assignments students are obliged to fulfilled during the semester;
- to label all educational materials (e.g. powerpoint presentations, handouts, according to the Guidelines pertaining to labeling (signage) of the Scholarship and Training Fund.



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#### Responsibilities of the Contracting Party:

- to prepare the course schedule;
- to schedule the exam for the course.

#### Professional requirements:

- at least a PhD in the field of social science or humanities;
- at least 4 academic articles/books chapters/ books related to the problem of a course;
- participation in at least 4 conferences, seminars related to the problem of a course;
- teaching at least one course in English over the past 2 years.

#### Intellectual rights:

The purchaser shall have non-exclusive intellectual rights to use of intellectual property in all of the following areas:

- sound recordings of seminar;
- any form of duplication and dissemination of materials, including granting public access to copies, for educational purposes, which shall not infringe upon the author's rights of publication;
- including the whole or parts of the work in brochures, catalogues, and other similar publications of the purchaser.

#### 2. Payment

Payment of remuneration will be made within 60 days of the completion of the work and after the confirmation by the purchaser of its adequate and timely completion.

#### 3. Dates

The course must be conducted during the Autumn semester in 2015/16 academic year.

- The closing date for applications is 15.00 CET on **Monday 24 August 2015**. Please include the words 'Enquiry no 51/RES/2014' in the subject line of all email correspondence.  
It is the responsibility of each applicant to ensure that his or her application arrives by the deadline.

All enquires will be treated in strict confidence; they will not form part of the selection decision.

6. Application should include:

- application form;
- CV confirming the qualification described in point 1.

7. Applications for this post will be considered by a selection committee containing representatives from the Institute of European Studies. The selection committee will also make the final decision as soon as possible after the closing date. Only applications meeting the formal criteria will be considered. Applications will be judged against the criteria which are set out in point no 1 (60%) and the remuneration requested (40%).

In the assessment of the remuneration, the commission will allocate points to the Contractors, calculated according to the following formula:

$P = C_{min}/C_o \times 10$ . where: P – the amount of points for the price  
C<sub>min</sub> – the lowest price offer amongst the tendered offers  
C<sub>o</sub> – price of the considered offer

The calculations will be made to two decimal places. The Contracting Party reserves the right to negotiate the price with the Contractor in instances when the tendered price is greater than the Project budget allows.

In the assessment of the academic experience (criteria set out in point no 1), the commission will allocate points to the Contractor according to the following formula:

- A. MA degree – 1 point  
PhD degree – 2 points  
PhD with habilitation – 3 points  
Professor – 4 points
- B. 4 academic articles/books chapters/ books – 1 point  
5-7 academic articles/books chapters/ books – 3 points  
8-10 academic articles/books chapters/ books – 5 points  
more than 10 academic articles/books chapters/ books – 7

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- points
- C. participation in 4 conferences, seminars – 1 point  
participation in 5-7 conferences, seminars – 3 points  
participation in 8-10 conferences, seminars – 5 points  
participation in more than 10 conferences, seminars – 7 points
  - D. teaching 1 course in English over the past 2 years – 1 point  
teaching more than 1 course over the past 2 years – 3 points

8. The Contracting Party will inform all Contractors via email or telephone about the results of the enquiry.

9. Data Protection

All data supplied by candidates will be used only for the purposes of determining their suitability for the post and will be held in accordance with the principles of the University's Data Protection Policy.

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
