MA in International Relations programme: Europe in the Visegrad Perspective

AUTUMN 2014/15

The courses below are intended principally for the students enrolled on the fee based MA in International Relations: Europe in the Visegrad Perspective programme and other students registered at the Jagiellonian University, including Erasmus/Socrates and other international exchange students, who may register for the courses providing that there is sufficient space – a maximum class size applies.

PLEASE NOTE: courses can only be taken for credit, NOT audited. Student undertake to actively participate in class and complete the required coursework, readings and preparation, as prescribed in the course syllabus

- **Registration and deregistration**

IMPORTANT: Registration does not mean that student is successfully registered for the class. On the day when registration will finish (around 20.00) or at the latest on Tuesday, 14th October, students should check at their USOS account whether they have been accepted to the class or not.

Acceptance into the course will be decided based on the ranking list and the time of online registration. The assigned rank determines the priority: the higher the rank the higher the possibility of being successfully accepted to the course (in the case that there will be more students interested in the course than places available).

The following ranking list applies for registration:

- Rank of 6: students enrolled on the fee based MA in International Relations: Europe in the Visegrad Perspective programme;
- Rank of 5: students enrolled in other European Studies international programmes;
- Rank of 4: Erasmus and CEEPUS students who are on direct exchange to the Institute of European Studies. These students may still be refused a place if the class is already full. ;
- Rank of 3: All other students of the Institute of European Studies;
- Rank of 2: All other international students of the Jagiellonian University (including Erasmus students on exchange to other units, international students in other paid programmes);
- Rank of 1: Students who does not belong to any of the above mentioned group and would like to attend classes

Students should go to the classes which they would like to attend during the registration period (**classes begin on Monday, 6 October**). Students must register and/or deregister online at <https://www.usosweb.uj.edu.pl> **starting on Monday, 6 October at 9:00 and ending on Monday, 13 October, 12:00**. Students should use their university login and password provided by the International Students Office. Please be advised: course must be linked to the student's programme on the day of registration! If not - you will be removed from the course on the another day after registering

- **Withdrawal:** Students who decide not to attend a course, in which they are enrolled, may withdraw after the registration will finish under the condition that the Director of Institute of European Studies will agree to students petition. A petition with a suitable request should be submitted no later than 30

days from the day when classes has started in the semester. Please be advised that NZAL (niezaliczenie = fail) will be entered in the student's records if he/she will not receive permission to withdraw and will not take the final exam.

- Students not enrolled on the fee based MA in International Relations: Europe in the Visegrad Perspective programme may not take more than **two** of the below courses. In the case that you have been accepted for more than two courses please contact the Administration Office at Garbarska 7a personally at the latest one week after the registration will finish.
